Manager's Corner

This year, up to now, has certainly been dismal. As the warm weather approached and anticipation of some great events loomed, we found ourselves watching as week after week, each of our spring events were cancelled. They fell like dominoes and emotions of excitement and anticipation were replaced with frustration and sadness. Our visitation plummeted, the services we could offer our visitors had

been reduced and revenue dropped significantly, and all we could do was watch this all unfold before our eyes. As I wrap up my article, I will think positively and anticipate this year ending on a good note with restrictions being lifted and visitors happy to get out and enjoy doing things in person instead of virtually.


